Deacon Wittreich

Deacon Helmut Wittreich, who serves at St. Peter the Apostle University and Community Parish, New Brunswick, was born in New York City. He is the son of Robert and

Marie Wittreich of Lancaster, Pa. He and his wife, Barbara, live in Somerset. They are the parents of a daughter, Kristin, who lives in Manhattan; and a son, Brian, who lives with his wife, Gennine (nee Damanski), in East Windsor. Deacon Wittreich received his initial diaconal training at the College of St. Elizabeth, Morristown, where he earned a certificate in diaconal min-

istry. He was ordained June 12, 2004, by Bishop Paul G. Bootkoski at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi, Metuchen.

Deacon Wittreich attended St. Matthias School, Ridgewood, N.Y., from kindergarten to second grade, and Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, Oakland, N.J., until the eighth grade. He graduated from Indian Hills High School in Oakland in 1978. Deacon Wittreich earned a Bachelor of Science degree in biochemistry at Lehigh

University, Bethlehem, Pa. He earned a Master of Divinity degree from Seton Hall University, South Orange, in 2010, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Fordham University, Bronx, N.Y., in 2018. Deacon Wittreich's doctoral dissertation is titled, "An Essential Model of Pastoral Leadership Criti-

Deacon Thomas C. Yondolino, who has exercised his ministry at St. Ambrose Par-

ish, Old Bridge, since 2013, was born in Passaic.

After attending Washington Erving No. 4 School, Garfield, he graduated from Garfield High School in 1963.

After studying at Newark College of Engineering, he married his wife, Lynn, in October 1965. They settled in Fair Lawn, where they raised their two children,

Jennifer and Michael. Deacon Yondolino and his wife, who died in December 2008, were actively involved in their parish, St. Ann's, as extraordinary ministers of holy Communion. They were also in charge of the confirmation program and pre-Cana program until they moved to Old Bridge.

While living in Fair Lawn, Deacon Yondolino was a member of the Fair Lawn Auxiliary Police, where he retired as a lieutenant in 1997. He was also hired to work part time by the Fair

Lawn Police Department as a Special Officer for juvenile crime.
